This compact was the joint effort of families, students, teachers, and administration. Each member of the development team offered their input into how we can help students achieve success.

At School...

The teacher will provide web links for students to use for Math fact fluency practice.

The teacher will ensure students have grade level appropriate material to take home to read with their family.

The teacher will provide Math Practice and Problem Solving supplements to review and reinforce concepts covered in class.

At Home...

The parent will have their child read 150 minutes per week and discuss new ideas and vocabulary from material read.

The parent will use the Family Engagement enrichment material and links sent home with students.

The parent will ensure the student completes the Math Practice and Problem Solving supplements for at least 60 minutes each week to review and reinforce concepts covered in class.

Students...

The student will read grade appropriate material for 150 minutes each week at home.

The student will use the web links provided for math fact fluency practice at least 30 minutes per week in school and/or at home.

The student will complete the Math Practice and Problem Solving supplements to review and reinforce concepts covered in class for at least 60 minutes each week.

SCA Goals:

As mandated by the School's charter, Savannah Classical students will surpass SCCPSS achievement levels.

All students in grades K-8 will meet or exceed benchmark assessment growth targets.

The majority of SCA staff will attend at least one Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA) meeting per semester.

SCA School Improvement Plan Goals:

Improve student outcomes on Georgia Milestone Assessments increasing CCRPI achievement points by 3%.

Improve student outcomes on Georgia Milestone Assessments in Science by 3% over last school year.

Students will participate in four formal writing assessments within the 2019-2020 school year with 80% of students scoring as meeting or exceeding by the fourth assessment.
