School/Teacher Responsibilities

Savannah Classical will:

- Hold Lexile goal setting conferences and share the goal setting worksheet with students and parents during academic nights and report card nights.
- Provide home site word list, flashcards, passages at the student's Lexile levels, websites, and other materials to support reading appropriate to the grade level.
- Provide mathematics flashcards, fluency activities and drills, websites and other grade level appropriate resources to promote mathematical fluency.
- Provide a list of skills to be mastered in reading and math for each grade level
- Send a list of online programs available for home use as well as login instructions.

Parent Responsibilities

We as Parents will:

- Review Lexile goals with my child and ensure my child reads three times per week in his/her Lexile band.
- Practice the reading activities with my child weekly and monitor progress and celebrate progress.
- Practice the mathematical fluency activities with my child weekly, monitor progress and celebrate progress.
- Use the mathematical fluency skill list to assist my child in mastering all grade levels fluency skills by the end of the year.
- If internet is available, have my child login and utilize at least one of the online programs per week.

Student Responsibilities

I, as a student will:

- Know my Lexile level and goal and read books in my Lexile band three times per week.
- Practice my reading weekly and monitor progress
- Practice my mathematical fluency weekly and monitor progress
- Use mathematical fluency skill list to be sure I master all my skills by the end of the year
- If internet is available, login to one or more of the computer programs each week.
